## HOW TO GET TO Berlin

### 1. By plane



**FROM TEGEL AIRPORT (TXL)** | All major international Airlines

**FROM SCHOENEFELD AIRPORT (SXF)** | EasyJet, Ryanair TUI, WOW Air, Wizzair



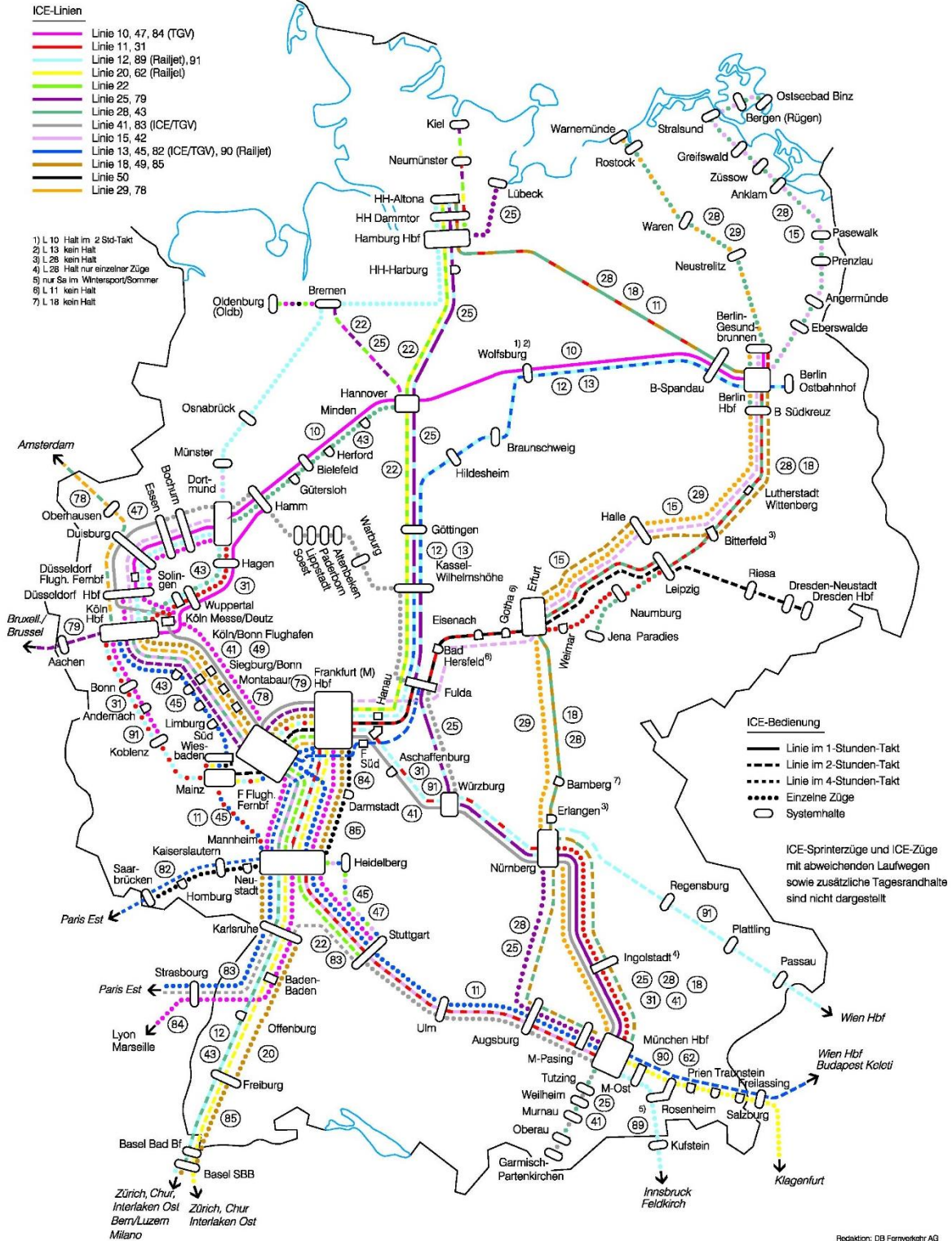
**RE7** (Direction Dessau, Hauptbahnhof) to S+U Berlin Hauptbahnhof

### 2. By train

Berlin enjoys excellent railway connectivity to all other parts of Germany and the rest of Europe. Berlin Hauptbahnhof functions as a single junction for all trains and as main train station for International trains however, there are four more railway stations: Ostbahnhof, Südkreuz, Berlin Spandau or Berlin Gesundbrunnen where trains run to and from various other cities.

## 3. By coach

Berlin enjoys good bus service, both within the city and to and from other cities in Germany. Flixbus and Eurolines are two of the major bus operators in Berlin.

## PUBLIC TRANSPORT

### 1. Within the city centre

#### ▪ U Bahn and S Bahn

There are **10 U-Bahn lines** and **15 S Bahn** operational in the city with trains running from 4 a.m. to 1 a.m. The service is excellent with good frequency of trains arriving every 5 minutes. You have a large choice of different passes, all of which are priced differently, depending on the duration, frequency of use, and the various zones of the Berlin region. S-Bahn tickets are also valid for buses, the U-Bahn, trams and vice versa.

#### ▪ BUS

If you don't want to miss out on the city sights while commuting from one landmark to another, buses are an excellent alternative to the metro. Most buses in Berlin run from early in the morning until late in the evening, although there are some that run until midnight, depending upon which part of the city you're in.

#### ▪ TAXI

Taxis are an easy and comfortable way to travel around the city. Berlin has compulsory tariffs for all taxis which apply 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

**Basic price:** 3.90 Euros

**Price per kilometre:** 2.00 Euros

**Price per kilometre from the seventh kilometre:** 1.50 Euros

**Taxi Fares to Schönefeld Airport:**

**From City West (Station Zoo):** about 45 Euros

**From City East (Alexanderplatz):** about 43 Euros
